committed by an individual(s) motivated by a bias against the victim's age, ancestry, color, disability, gender, national origin, race, religion, religious practice, sexual orientation or gender expression, regardless of whether the belief or perception is correct.

Bias-related crimes can increase in frequency during certain times of the year and may be fueled by the consumption of alcohol or other substances. These crimes are unique in that they a ect not only the victim(s), but also the group to which the victim belongs, and, as such, threaten to tear at the fabric that holds the community together.

WHAT TO DO IF A BIAS-RELATED INCIDENT TAKES PLACE:

Your safety is of utmost priority. If you are in danger,
go to a safe place immediately and contact the
proper authorities by dialing 911. Please refer to the
